## You may Qualify if you:

- Are 65 or older before December 31, 2014
- Own or rent in Massachusetts as principal residence

## How do I apply?

To claim the Circuit Breaker Credit, you must file a Massachusetts state income tax return, even if you typically don't file a return— *and*—include Schedule CB, the Circuit Breaker Credit form. You can file your tax return for FREE online through the Department of Revenue's [WebFile for Income](http://mass.gov/dor/wfi) at [mass.gov/dor/wfi](http://mass.gov/dor/wfi) and be guided by a question and answer format. Or, you may download [forms](#) to be filled out.

## Where can I get help for FREE to prepare my tax return and Schedule CB?

If you need help, VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) helps low income and middle income people fill out tax returns for free. Call them at 1-800-906-9887.
